Our report is informed by the principles of the International Integrated Reporting (IR) Framework. While we are still on our journey to achieve full IR, in this report we identify three of the six capitals of integrated reporting (human, financial and intellectual) as the main sources of energy by which we generate social value. We think of SSI's value as falling into six categories, or outcomes. Most of these outcomes match the integrated reporting concept of social and relationship capital, but in this year's report we have not provided detailed mapping of outcomes to capitals
